<b>Nomination Deadline</b>	<b>May 1st</b>	<b>October 15th</b>
<b>Nomination Procedure</b> <i>(by home institution)</i>	Home institutions must nominate their students by email with the following student's information : full name, email address, field & current year of study Nominated students will receive an email with information about registration and application, together with the online application link.	
<b>Application Deadline</b>	<b>May 15th</b>	<b>October 31st</b>
<b>Application Procedure</b> <i>(by student)</i>	Before applying, the international student should, firstly, check if there is an existing partnership between Bordeaux INP and the home institution establishing an academic or double degree exchange. If so, they should seek the authorization from the institution of origin. Once the international student has been nominated by their Home Institution, we will send them the application instructions they should follow.  If there is no partnership, nor academic exchange agreement between the two institutions, the international student must follow the "Études en France" procedure. <b>Application Documents</b> <i>(provided by the student)</i>	The following documents must be uploaded by the student when applying online: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- A resume (in French or in English)</li> <li>- A cover letter (in French or in English)</li> <li>- Their Learning Agreement</li> <li>- Their last Academic transcript of records</li> <li>- A Proof of language proficiency (French B1 recommended)</li> </ul> Be aware that additional documents may be asked during the enrolment process.	

Acceptance	The International Office will send by email a "Letter of Acceptance" to the student within 3 weeks after online application deadline.

Courses Choice	Before the start of their academic exchange at ENSEGID, prospective students must choose the courses they are willing to follow and seek its recognition from the academic advisors at their home university as well as at the receiving university. Confirmation of the choice of courses/modules must be done at their arrival, depending on the availability of courses and the authorisation of the programme director.

Language Requirements	Most of our courses are taught in French. If international students would like to follow courses in French, they are required to take a language test in French upon arrival. So, it is recommended to have a B1 Level in French according the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFRL). However, starting September 2024, ENSEGID will offer an international course taught in English for international students. A B1 level certificate (TOEFL, IELTS) in English is expected from international students. <b>PRATICAL INFORMATION</b>	
Visa	Students from a member state of the European Union or European Economic Area, or Switzerland, do not need a visa to reside in France during their academic exchange. However, students who are not from a member state of the European Union or European Economic Area, or Switzerland, need to follow a visa procedure. Depending on the nationality, the situation and the length of the stay, the student may be able to obtain a visa to study or conduct research in France. Accommodation - CROUS	It is possible for an international student to get a CROUS accomodation. The provided accommodation is a room in a CROUS dormitory or a studio in a CROUS residence. <b>But be aware that the CROUS has a limited number of rooms reserved for exchange students. We cannot fully guarantee a room. So, students are strongly advised to do their accommodation research well in advance. Also, they</b>
