Application Information

- Official nomination from home university is required for all exchange applications
- The student must be enrolled in a degree program at the student's home institution.
- *Required Documents:*
 - Digital version of the online application form (signed by

institutional coordinators)

- Learning Agreement
- Transcript of records
- Documents certifying B1 Spanish language proficiency and B2 in English for studying the International Semester
- 2 Passport photos
- Erasmus nomination/ application deadlines: June 1st for fall semester. December 1st for spring semester.
- Magalhaes and other programmes nomination deadlines: April 15th for fall semester. October 1st for spring semester.
- Magalhaes and other programmes application deadlines: June 1st for fall semester. December 1st for spring semester.

Academic Calendar

- Fall semester classes begin the first week of September and end the last full week before December 25th.
- The winter vacation period begins a few days before December 25th and ends the first Monday after January 6th.
- Fall semester exams are administered in January-February.
- Spring semester classes begin the first week of February and end the last week of May.
- Spring semester exams are administered in June-July.

Course Information

Language of instruction:

- **All classes are taught in Spanish.** Incoming students should demonstrate at least B1 level in Spanish (higher level is recommended).

- It is usually possible to undertake and write a final project in English.

ETSIDI offers five four-year undergraduate degrees in Chemical Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Electronic Engineering and Automation, Mechanical Engineering, and Industrial Design and Product Development.

An incoming exchange student may take courses from any degree program covered by the agreement between the student's home institution and the ETSIDI. Some classes are offered in multiple degree programs.

Credits: The normal load is approximately 30 ECTS each semester, but formal minimum imposed is 20 ects for exchange students.

Each class is offered in a particular semester at undergraduate level. Semesters 1, 3, 5 and 7 are given in the fall semester. Semesters 2, 4, 6 and 8 are given in the spring semester.

Students are advised to be attentive that the classes they chose do not meet at the same time. Individual questions about the schedule of classes should be addressed to the ETSIDI's Erasmus office.

While it is possible to take classes offered in other schools of the UPM and exchange students have done so, it may require extra planning, as the UPM's schools are not all located in the same part of Madrid.
